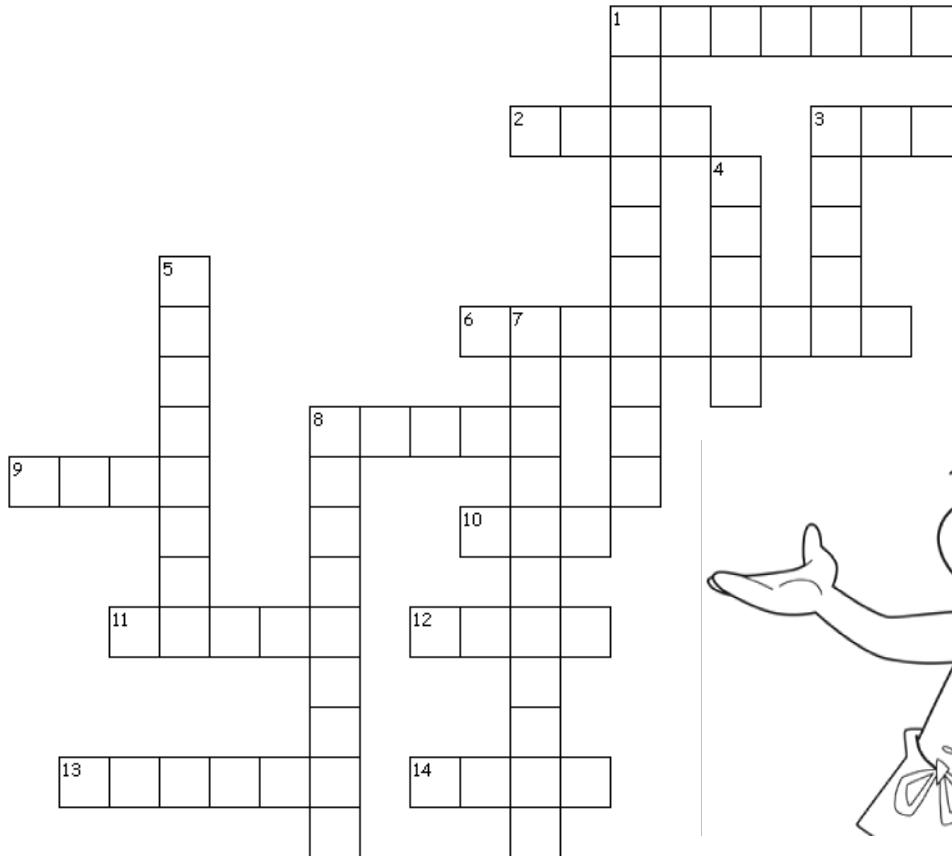


The Sun Show Criss Cross

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For Extra Credit

Example: The boy is concerned because he can't see the sun's invisible ultraviolet rays that might give him a sunburn. To block the sun he could wear a hat with a wide brim, sunglasses, a shirt with long sleeves, and pants (or long skirt if a girl) and put on sunscreen. For water sports, a swimshirt would be good. The boy might also find some shade under a tree, or use an umbrella. Being sun-safe would help him prevent skin cancer.
