

- 8 Covers your chest and back for pool or surf (2 words)



#### For Extra Credit

**Example:** The boy is concerned because he can't see the sun's invisible <u>ultraviolet</u> rays that might give him a <u>sunburn</u>. To block the <u>sun</u> he could wear a <u>hat</u> with a <u>wide brim</u>, <u>sunglasses</u>, a <u>shirt</u> with long sleeves, and <u>pants</u> (or long <u>skirt</u> if a girl) and put on <u>sunscreen</u>. For water sports, a <u>swimshirt</u> would be good. The boy might also find some <u>shade</u> under a <u>tree</u>, or use an <u>umbrella</u>. Being sun-safe would help him prevent skin <u>cancer</u>.
